Greetings.

Article VIII.F, Establishment, Advancement, and Continuation of Subdivisions, states that members of an unchartered subdivision (March, County, Barony, or House) have the right to remove themselves from said subdivision at any time, even if taking this action reduces the estate below minimum numbers. The ruling noble or nobles must be made aware of this decision so that they may effectively manage their estate.

Nowhere in this section or in the bylaws does it state how, or who, must make the ruling noble or nobles aware of the decision of one of their members to leave.

In order to help facilitate this Article, and to avoid confusion and discrepancies, when a member does remove themselves, the following writ is enacted:

Members desiring to remove themselves from an unchartered subdivision must submit this desire in writing. This written desire to be removed may be submitted to any member. The member who receives this written document, must, within a reasonable period, make the ruling noble or nobles who are affected by this removal aware of this decision. A reason for the member's desiring to leave does not have to be included in the written document. Once the ruling noble or nobles are notified, the appropriate Ministries and the ruling Crown must be notified so that the proper changes can be made to the records. As email is an acceptable form of communication, all notifications may take this form.
